Rice Lane Community Association has been awarded a three year grant of nearly £40,000 annually by the National Lottery Community Fund. With this we can do more activities, for local people, helping to improve health and wellbeing by means of social contact, constructive activities and learning creative skills. We are preparing a new programme to begin these projects shortly. There will be an emphasis on children, young and elderly people.

We will have to keep good records, to show that we have met the aims of the grant. There is also a new duty for RLCA, since we have to raise matching funds, on top of the usual running costs. This will come to more than £160,000 a year. As well as our normal monthly events, we are organising quarterly 'big' events, looking to increase our self funding. Even at our most optimistic, these might increase our income from about 10% of costs to 15%, still leaving a large gap to fill. So any help our friends and supporters can provide will be very welcome.

Easter Holiday Playscheme

We are again providing fun and food for local children during the Easter School Holidays. We hope to be able to provide for all the children who attend. As we are on the Liverpool/Bootle border, many of children come from Bootle. Thanks to the efforts of our Farm Manager, Lucy, we have for the first time been granted £1600 by Sefton Council to cover the costs for Bootle children.

Last autumn our daddy sheep was busy and we are looking forward to the arrival of new lambs. As a sample here are some of the lambs born last year.




February Fun and Food week
